Horses not competing in classes must have an entry form for each show, with signatures, current Coggins, vaccinations proof and pay a non-compete fee for each show, an office fee for each show and either grounds or stall fee. Competitors with weekend stall must pay non-compete fee and office fee for Saturday and Sunday. Competitors that are showing and have signed up for classes on one day, and wish to be a non-compete on the other day, should fill out a show entry for the day for competing, and a second entry for the non-compete day.

RULES AND GENERAL INFORMATION

- **1.** Amateurs, Juniors & Young Riders, Horses: Amateurs are defined by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book. *All riders entering the Amateur classes must possess or have applied for an USEF Amateur Card prior to riding in the class.* Jr/YR: May compete as Junior until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 18. Young Riders may compete in FEI Young Rider classes from 16 until the end of the calendar year in which they turn 21. **Horse age:** Horse is considered to be 1 year old on the first day of January following the actual date of foaling. For under-saddle classes, horse must be at least 36 months of age at time of competition. FEI Para horses must be at least 6 years old.
- **2. CONDITIONS OF ENTRY:** Every horse entered for competition will be under the guidance of the Horse Show Management, but the Horse Show Management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Horse Show Management, Facility, Licensee, or their agents, harmless for any loss or accident to his horse, horses or equipment which may occur.

3. ENTRY PROCEDURES: PLEASE READ CAREFULLY!!

All entries should be <u>created</u> on EqEntries.com. If you do not already have a user account with EqEntries.com, please sign up. You can print and mail your entry with a personal check, or pay online with a credit card. If you choose to pay online (by credit card), there is an online submission fee. There is no charge to join EqEntries, create an entry, or print an entry. So, if you choose to pay by personal check (and mail-in), the service is free. A. Entries and Fees for Shows:

- i. <u>Mail-In Entries</u>: Fill out a separate entry form for each show on Eqentries.com (You can create these entries online at <u>www.EqEntries.com</u> see above.) For each horse entered, send your completed entry form, including USDF & USEF membership cards (print from www.eqverification.org one sheet), USEF Federation Agreement and USEF waiver, Coggins, vaccinations proof, health certificate and a check for each show day entered, made payable to Marilyn Kulifay (no credit cards accepted using mail-in entries). Mail to Marilyn Kulifay, Entry Secretary, P.O. Box 3452, Houston, TX 77253. No postdated checks accepted. **Received by date is February 22.**
- ii. On-Line Entries (credit card payments): Go to www.EquestrianEntries.com register, and select classes, fees, stabling (delete prior year's documents before uploading new documents Coggins, vaccinations proof & Federation Agreement, USEF waivers, health certificate). Upload documents to your EquestrianEntries account before submitting payment. Can also email documents to marily2004@yahoo.com Fill out a separate entry form for each show. Horse not officially entered until completed entry and payment received.
- **B.** Horse Show Office: We will operate a limited office. Text or call show office with scratches, questions, issues. Horse show office will be staffed beginning at 1:00 pm on Friday, and one hour before the first ride to one hour after the last ride on Saturday and Sunday. Phone or text: (510) 672-3260.

- **C. At the Show:** No bridle numbers will be issued without full payment and <u>completed entries</u>, *including signatures* and emergency contact information.
- D. Entry Acceptance: Entries will be accepted on a first come-first serve basis based on On-Line Entry or received by date until classes (or judging time) are filled. Entries received after classes are filled will be notified and, if desired, put on a waiting list (in the order of receipt or on-line entry date). Those entries received after closing will be accepted at the discretion of the show management, based on a space available basis and charged a late fee per show. Those on the waiting list who entered show prior to closing date and did not get into the show will have all fees refunded. NO PHONE entries. FAX entries or entries attached to emails may be accepted at the discretion of the show secretary and as a Special Handling item (see fees above). Special Handling entries must have prior email permission by Entry Secretary necessary and a check must be received within 3 days. All entries must be made on official entry blanks or on-line and completed as to classes, exhibitors, owners, trainers, coaches, horse names, addresses, phone numbers, association numbers, USEF & USDF cards, USEF Federation Agreement and USEF Waivers signatures and include a copy of current Coggins, vaccinations proof and health certificate. Parents or guardians must sign the official entry blank of a minor before a number will be released. Make sure that Emergency Contact information is complete. Management reserves the right to refuse any entry. Entries MUST BE RECEIVED BY Feb. 22, 2022, or entered on-line by Feb. 22, 2022.
- **E.** A copy of horses' Coggins pulled within 12 months of the show date must accompany each entry (draw date on or after 3/07/2021). Horse's name on Coggins must match name on entry form and cards. Original Coggins must be available for inspection during the show. Failure to include Coggins prior to show may result in incomplete entry fees per show, and may result in elimination without return of fees. Any horse that develops a communicable disease or becomes ill, may be removed at management's discretion. Competition Management will assume no responsibility for the health of horses being stabled. Owners are on notice that they enter their horses at their own risk.
- F. Each competitor is responsible for supplying management with the correct association numbers (USDF and USEF) for horse, owner, rider, and trainer, before the day(s) of the competition. The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be counted toward national awards. Horse name and owner on entry blank must match USEF and USDF documentation. For GAIG/USDF qualifying classes, please make sure to have the proper memberships. Also note that if a horse has more than one owner, at least one owner must have both active USEF and active USDF Participating or Business membership.
- **G. Opportunity Classes:** These classes do not require USEF & USDF memberships for the horse, rider or owner. USEF drug fees do not apply. If horse, rider or owner has membership numbers, please indicate so on entry. Riders may **not** cross enter into other classes.
- **H.** Any and all handlers, assistant handlers, drivers, riders, trainers, owners, agents, lessees, parent or guardian of a junior exhibitor, and coaches of horses (or riders) are required to sign an entry blank and with the exception of a parent or guardian of a junior exhibitor, must be USEF members or pay a Show Pass (non-member) fee.
- I. Show management reserves the right to limit entries, add, combine or divide classes, modify the schedule, add, substitute or change officials, modify or cancel awards and prizes and/or make whatever changes are required by circumstances to the competition specifications listed herein. Show management reserves the right to cancel classes insufficiently filled and to refuse or require withdrawal of an entry for cause deemed sufficient by show management.
- **J.** Management reserves the right to cancel any classes due to hazardous weather, Acts of God, accident, or emergency. Every effort will be made to reschedule with priority given to any qualifying classes being offered. No refunds for cancellations due to hazardous weather, Acts of God, accidents or emergencies. Refunds will be made in accordance with scratch policy (See #4.)
- **4. SCRATCHES & SUBSTITUTIONS**: Exhibitors have the responsibility of informing the <u>Show Secretary</u> of their intention to scratch in writing. Please keep your receipt of notification of scratching for proof. No refunds given at the show will be mailed or credited back to credit card, if practicable.
- **A**. Scratches of the whole show <u>made in writing</u> to Show Entry Secretary on or before the online closing date may be made for any reason and all fees except office fee and on-line submission fee will be refunded. No refunds will be given for scratches of the whole show after closing date except for fees collected on behalf of USEF (drug & USEF

fees) and USDF & SWDC qualifying fees. Any scratches of the whole show after the closing date are liable for all unpaid fees, including but not limited to entry and office fees, and will be billed accordingly.

- **B.** Scratches of a class will receive no refund. Scratches of a class must be made in writing by email or text, and if at the show, with the show secretary.
- **C.** All "no shows" that have not contacted the show office prior to first ride will be considered a scratch for the rest of the shows (both I & II) and time slots may be filled.
- **D.** After closing date, one horse may be substituted for another for a \$35.00 substitution fee (per show) if horse status (USDF/USEF memberships) and <u>classes and divisions</u> (O, AA, Jr) entered <u>are the same</u> and <u>a note is provided from a veterinarian that the entered horse has been injured or is ill.</u> New separate entry form per show must be filled out with substituted horse's information, cards, Coggins, vaccinations proof and signatures. <u>Riders</u> may be substituted for one another for a \$35.00 substitution fee, if the rider's status (and division) is the same regarding memberships and they are able to ride in the class that was entered by the original rider (i.e. open, amateur or junior) <u>with a doctor's note</u> that the entered rider became ill or injured. Must be same classes & divisions. See above must fill out new entry blanks with Coggins, signatures, etc. <u>A horse or rider may be substituted, but not both.</u>
- **5. LATE ENTRIES**: All entries must be entered online on or received by the designated closing date otherwise will be considered a late entry. Each late entry will be charged a late fee per show. Late entries will be accepted and given a ride time only as schedule permits and at management's discretion.
- **6. UNPAID CHARGES:** Any exhibitor leaving the show with an unpaid balance of entry fees or other fees due, will be billed for these charges and a billing fee will be added to the total due. Until these charges are settled, all future entries of horse, rider and owner will be returned AND USEF Rule 913 will be invoked.
- **7. RETURNED CHECKS**: A fee will be assessed for each returned check. All fees must be made good prior to packet distribution.
- **8. RIDE TIMES**: Preliminary ride times will be uploaded to foxvillage.com or e-mailed to the rider about three days before the show and official ride times will be posted by noon on Friday on foxvillage.com Any updates for Show II will be posted on foxvillage.com by noon on Saturday. It is the responsibility of the rider to inform the management of any time conflicts as soon as possible. Any changes after closing date initiated by rider or owner will incur a \$15.00 per change fee, and are at the discretion of show secretary/management.
- **9. BRIDLE NUMBERS:** Bridle numbers for the show entered must be worn at all times when a horse is out of its stall even on non-show days. Each horse/rider combination is considered a separate entry and must fill out a separate entry form and will be issued a different number.
- **10. FREESTYLES:** Please submit a document verifying eligibility per DR 129.9. Music for all freestyles on CD must be put in box at show office on Friday. Sound check time will be announced, posted or emailed. Competitors are responsible for picking up their music before the end of show.
- **11. FACILITIES & ARENAS:** All tests and warm-up will be ridden in either indoor or outdoor arenas with sand/clay or ESI footing. Main Arena and Barn C warm-up have ESI footing. Tellepsen Arena and warm-up has sand/clay footing. Competition arenas are 20m x 60m (outdoor or covered). FEI Para test of choice and Eventing tests will be ridden in the 20m x 60m arena. No one on foot is allowed in designated warm-ups. <u>Lunging permitted in designated outdoor areas only</u>. All horses in the warm-up arenas must wear their competition numbers. All arenas must be vacated while equipment is being used. Arenas close at 8:30 PM. Competitors may use competition arenas up to one hour before the show starts each day. Schedule for schooling will be emailed to riders or posted at the show. Two dressage arenas may be set up in the arena. To the extent that the measurement requirements of DR126f8 (regarding distance between arenas (less than 5 m) and distance to public (less than 1.5 m)-solid walls) are not met for Level 3, then those classes (eligible to be level 2 classes) taking place in those two arenas will be run as Level 2 (all divisions).
- **12. SIGNAGE:** No staples or nails are allowed to be affixed to any Great Southwest Equestrian Center property, except for stall cards. Individuals wanting to tape advertisements or flyers to walls, must first obtain permission in writing from Great Southwest Equestrian Center. Permission agreement must be shown to Show Management prior to display and/or taping or flyers/advertisements will be removed.
- **13. RIBBONS AND AWARDS:** Award to 1st place winner and ribbons awarded to sixth place for Intro through FEI. Qualifying classes will be run concurrently and not be pinned separately. Champion and Reserve Champion ribbons will be awarded for overall high point for Open, Amateur and Junior (excludes Freestyles, Pas De Deux, Quadrille,

Eventing, Equitation, Opportunity, Developing Horse, Young Horse and Materiale classes) on Saturday. Competitors are responsible for collecting their awards and ribbons prior to the end of the show on Sunday.

- **14. SCORES:** It is the Competitors' responsibility to verify the accuracy of scores. Scoring errors must be reported to the Show Secretary within ONE hour of official posting of the scores from the last class of the show day during which the score was earned. Results will be uploaded to www.foxvillage.com/Results
- **15. MANAGEMENT:** Horse Show Management reserves the right to itself to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of any incident in the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Management; their decision will be final. The Horse Show Management reserves itself the right to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries and cancel award prizes, without claim to damages; to change, cancel or combine any classes, to reschedule classes after due notice to exhibitors, or to change rings or rotate judges, and assess fees/penalties.
- **16. BEDDING:** Only shavings provided by facility for bedding. Order all shavings by Tuesday, March 1, 2022. **No outside shavings permitted.** If outside shavings are brought in, GSWEC assesses a \$100.00 penalty per horse stall. Determination to be made by GSWEC.

17. STABLING

- A. Barn assignments will be based on any requests and time/date payment made. Limited number of 12' X 12' stalls available – enter early for best availability. Barn stabling and stall size will be accommodated as possible but no guarantees on stall size. Permanent stalls are wood, 10' X 10' with doors, with a limited number of 12' X 12' stalls with doors. Two bags of shavings are included for weekend stall. Stabling requests accepted and will be granted if possible. There are no one-day stalls in the 12'X12' size. Additional stabling days (i.e. Thursday arrival) will be charged per day (both horse and tack stalls). If not stabling, a grounds fee per day must be paid. Stallions must be stabled. If a stallion requires empty stalls around it, please note, and purchase additional tack stalls as needed. B. Electrical requirements must not exceed 2.5 amps per stall. Stall assignments will be emailed and packets put on stalls. Early arrivals and late departures are only available by arrangement with Show Entry Secretary at \$45/night/horse. Stalls must be vacated by 6 PM Sunday, except by prior arrangement with show management. Anyone using (without having paid) an unassigned stall or tack stall, even temporarily, will be charge one half a weekend stall fee or \$65.00, whichever is greater. Anyone who has moved stalls after arrival at the show grounds must clean the stall from which they moved to the satisfaction of show committee/management, or will be charged one half a weekend stall fee or \$65.00, whichever is greater. Anyone who places manure in an "empty" or unused stall will be charged one half a weekend stall fee or \$65.00, whichever is greater. Anyone, who has not paid for a stall and is using (even temporarily) an empty stall for personal items, or to tack up, will be charged the weekend rate for a tack stall.
- C. No smoking in the barns & offices. Smoking areas will be designated.
- D. Horses not to be tied to trees or railing. No unattended trailer tying.
- **18. SCHOOLING HORSES:** Horses not competing in the show must be registered with the Horse show office and will be given a number to be worn at all times outside of the stall. A stall or ground fee and a non-compete and office fee per show (day) must be paid. Any person(s) riding a schooling horse must have signed an official entry blank and/or release form and have provided a current Coggins, vaccination record and health certificate PRIOR TO UNLOADING HORSE. Schooling of non-compete horses are allowed in the warm-up area during competition hours if there is ample room in the arena. Non-compete horses may be requested to move to a different area or arena, as determined by Show Management or the Technical Delegate. Entry to include the correct number of stabling days. **FOR USEF QUALIFYING FOR CHILDREN, PONY RIDERS, JUNIORS, YOUNG RIDERS, AND BRENTINA CUP (YOUNG ADULTS):** For USEF qualifying for Children, Pony Riders, Juniors, Young Riders, Brentina Cup (Young Adults), Intermediaire I, Grand Prix, and Young & Developing Horse divisions, within 24 hours prior and at no time during the competition, may any horse entered in a USEF Qualifying class be ridden by anyone other than the athlete entered in that class on that horse, under penalty of disqualification from the class for USEF championship qualifying purposes. Exception: grooms riding on a loose rein. For purposes of this rule, the competition starts when horse and athlete arrive on the show grounds and ends at the conclusion of the USEF licensed competition.
- **19.** Anyone mounting, getting on, riding or trying a horse at the facility during the weekend of the show (including Thursday & Friday) must sign a show release and wear a helmet.
- **20. VETERINARIAN/FARRIER:** Vet and farrier on call each show day. Phone numbers and information will be posted at the show grounds and in the show secretary's office prior to the start of the show.

- 21. PONY MEASUREMENT: Please notify Show Entry Secretary with entry if pony needs to be measured at the competition. If there are ponies to measure, measurement will take place on Saturday between 7 am 10 am and those competitors will be notified as to exact time & location. A pony does not exceed 148 cm without shoes and 149 cm with shoes. Any pony competing in classes limited to ponies must submit a copy of a USEF measurement certificate with its entry.
- **22. DOGS:** Dogs are not permitted to be loose on competition grounds and must be on a leash or otherwise contained. Individuals must not lead dogs on a leash while mounted. Dog owners are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from their dogs' behaviors. Dog owners failing to comply with this rule may be subject to penalty under Chapters 6 and 7of the USEF General Rules, as well as issuance of warning cards. Loose dogs will be impounded and the owner may be assessed a fine up to \$200.00.
- 23. CONCESSIONS: Concessions are available at the show grounds.
- **24. PARKING:** Parking is allowed in designated areas only. Trailers are to be parked in designated trailer parking area. RV parking is available and will be assigned by show secretary. Please designate electrical requirement on entry blank. Violators improperly parked, including NO PARKING ZONES and FIRE LANES, will be issued citations and/or towed from premises at the owner's expense. **Please do not park in front of a trailer, blocking access to the hitch, unless it is your trailer.**
- 25. SHARPS CONTAINERS: Management will provide Sharps containers in the barns for competitors' use. Competition management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments. If local law has different requirements, local law will prevail.
- **26. PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR:** Anyone mounted on a horse must wear securely fastened ASTM protective headgear.
- **27. PRIZES:** Award for Trainer (or instructor or coach) for bringing the most students competing each student must ride at least one class on Saturday or Sunday, and must clearly list the trainer, instructor or coach on entry that they "belong" to for purposes of this award. Award is a gift or gift certificate.
- **28. VACCINATIONS:** Competitor to provide flu/rhino vaccination proof must be within 6 months of show BUT should be no closer than 7 days before the show.
- **29.** Great Southwest Equestrian Center website contains information on their health certificate requirement. All horses must have a health certificate with a date within 21 days of the arrival on show grounds indicating that horse has not been treated for an elevated temperature or any herd health in the last 30 days. Please visit www.gswec.com for more information.

USEF Provisions

Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current US Equestrian Federation Rule Book and will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$45 Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR218) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at www.usef.org.

GR845 Equine Vaccination Rule

- 1. At Federation licensed competitions, horses entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management. Documentation should consist of one of the following methods mentioned below. The frequency of vaccine administration should be per the vaccine manufacturers' or veterinarian's recommendations. It is recommended that vaccines are administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian.
- 2. In the case of vaccines administered by a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide documentation from the veterinarian on documenting that the horse in question received the vaccinations; name of the vaccines and date of vaccine administration.
- 3. In the case of vaccines administered by a person other than a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a receipt of the vaccine purchase which is signed by the owner, or agent with care, custody, and control of the horse; name, serial number and expiration date of the vaccine' and date of vaccine administration.
- 4. In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccinations due to a history of adverse reactions, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a letter from the veterinarian on official letterhead stating that the horse in question cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns and a log of temperatures taken twice daily for the seven days prior to entering the competition grounds. These horses must also have their temperature taken and logged twice daily while on the competition grounds. The log of temperatures should be provided to the Competition Management, steward, or technical delegate when requested.
- 5. Competition Management may not amend or enhance vaccination requirements without prior approval of the Veterinary Committee. BOD 1/17/15 Effective 12/1/15.

MOTORIZED VEHICLES: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent(s), legal guardian(s), or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

Helpful hints for Equestrian Entries

- 1. Create an account if you don't have one, including horses, rider(s), trainer, coach, owner. Include all USEF and USDF numbers.
- 2. Create your entry, including classes, stabling, qualifying fees, etc.
- 3. If you already have an account, delete old documents before uploading new ones.
- 4. Double check your entries and uploads before paying.
- 5. Once you pay, any additional documents will need to be emailed to marily2004@yahoo.com
 EqEntries does not forward any documents to the show secretary after the entry has been paid.
- 6. Even if you do not intend to pay with EqEntries, please create an entry on-line. You can print it and mail it (if you are mailing) and EqEntries will automatically generate your cards from the numbers that you input when you created your entry.

For details on member benefits, including educational programs, awards, and other opportunities, refer to the *USDF Member Guide* or the USDF website at www.usdf.org.

This competition is recognized by USDF for 2022

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those
 sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at
 Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are
 exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot,
 academy, and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM
 identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$90), 5-years (\$360), or life (\$1,800). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$72). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards Program and the USDF Regional Schooling Show Awards Program. **Business Membership (BM):** A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$240) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$35 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$35). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded, but will NOT be counted towards Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$80. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$115) is eligible for Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

How to Join USDF

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

- On the USDF website: www.usdf.org. You can submit the application online or download the form and fax or mail it to the USDF office.
- In the show office at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions classified by USEF as Dressage Competitions, and Regular Competitions which are open to all breeds.

The effective date of membership is the date the form and correct fees are received in the USDF office or, if applying at a competition, the date accepted by the competition secretary, provided the application is signed and dated by the competition secretary, member, and/or horse owner on that same day.



2022 Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage **Championships**

A single Regional Dressage Championship program organized by the United States Dressage Federation (USDF), and recognized by the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (USEF), will be held in each of the nine USDF regions. In addition, Alaska and Hawaii may each hold state championships if an official request from a Group Member Organization (GMO) is received by April 1 of the prior year. The Regional Championship Program Rules can be found on the USDF website at www.usdf.org. Please refer to the 2022 USDF Member Guide for the comprehensive list of rules and requirements for this program.

Membership/Registration Requirements for Qualifying and Championships

All memberships and registrations/recordings must be correct and current at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

Rider:

- Must have a USDF Participating* Membership (PM).
- Must have a USEF membership (Active or Life). •

Horse:

- Must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR).
- Must have a USEF (Annual or Lifetime) Horse Recording.
- USDF horse registration and USEF horse recording must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s). A horse is not required to have breed registry papers.

Owner:

- Must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership and a USEF membership (Junior Active, Senior Active, Life, or Recorded Farm (with Active Farm Owner)). If the horse has more than one owner, at least one owner must have both active USEF membership and active USDF Participating or Business Membership and must be the owner of record with USEF and USDF. For a business or farm to be the valid owner under this requirement, it must be listed as an owner of the horse with both USEF and USDF.
- * PMs are USDF members who join USDF directly. USDF Group Members (GM) are ineligible.

Minimum Qualifying Scores: One set of nationally-standardized qualifying scores has been established for all USEF/USDF Regional Championships, for Training Level through Grand Prix, in three divisions: open, adult amateur and junior/young rider. FEI Junior and FEI Young Rider classes have only one respective division. Freestyles have only open divisions.

For and in consideration of United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. dba US Equestrian ("USEF") allowing me, the undersigned, to participate in any capacity (including as a rider, driver, handler, vaulter, longeur, lessee, owner, agent, coach, official, trainer or volunteer) in a USEF sanctioned, licensed or approved event or activity, including but not limited to equestrian clinics, practices, shows, competitions and related or incidental activities and ("USEF Event" or "USEF Events"); I, for myself, and on behalf of my spouse, children, heirs and next of kin, and any legal and personal representatives, executors, administrators, successors,, and assigns, hereby agree to and make the following contractual representations pursuant to this Agreement (the "Agreement"):

A. RULES AND REGULATIONS: I hereby agree that I have read, understand, and agree to be bound by all applicable Federation Bylaws, rules, and policies including the USEF Safe Sport Policy and Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies (MAAPP) as published at www.usef.org, as amended from time to time.

B. ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISK: I knowingly, willingly, and voluntarily acknowledge the inherent risks associated with the sport of equestrian and know that horseback riding and related equestrian activities are inherently dangerous, and that participation in any USEF Event involves risks and dangers including, without limitation, the potential for serious bodily injury (including broken bones, head or neck injuries), sickness and disease (including communicable diseases), trauma, pain & suffering, permanent disability, paralysis and death; loss of or damage to personal property (including my mount & equipment) arising out of the unpredictable behavior of horses; exposure to extreme conditions and circumstances; accidents involving other participants, event staff, volunteers or spectators; contact or collision with other participants and horses, natural or manmade objects; adverse weather conditions; facilities issues and premises conditions; failure of protective equipment (including helmets); inadequate safety measures; participants of varying skill levels; situations beyond the immediate control of the USEF Event organizers and competition management; and other undefined, not readily foreseeable and presently unknown risks and dangers ("Risks").
