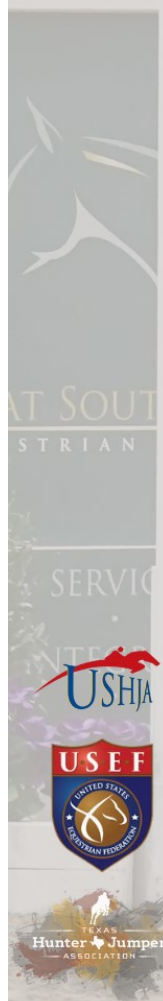

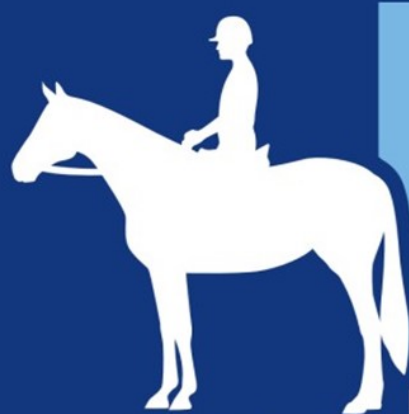

GENERAL RULES & INFORMATION

ENTRIES

Enter online at www.horseshowonline.com. Every entry blank must have the signature of the owner/authorized agent, trainer & be accompanied by an open check or valid credit card information. NO NUMBERS WILL BE ISSUED WITHOUT AN OPEN CHECK OR VALID CREDIT CARD INFORMATION. There will be a \$75.00 office/services fee for every horse on the show grounds. Management reserves the right to refuse any entry for any reason.

Horses, on the grounds, not entered in any classes, must have a completed entry blank on file in the office and will be charged a \$100 non-showing fee per week. Horses not accruing a minimum of \$100 in entry fees may be charged the non-showing fee in lieu of entry fees.

***Warning: Horses that compete in a class in which they are not properly entered will be charged a double entry fee.**

***Attention foreign exhibitors: All fees MUST be paid in "US Funds".**

ENTRY CLOSING DATE

Entries are due by **Oct. 25th**. Post entries/New entries (new or different horses) made after this date will incur a one-time late fee of \$75.00.

ADDS/SCRATCHES

All ADDS must be completed online at www.horseshowonline.com OR the Show Office NO LATER THAN 5:00pm the day PRIOR to the class. Time permitting, same day adds will be accepted at the ingate and will be put on a wait list of each show ring. Scratches will be accepted at any time prior to the start of the class – Scratch Fee may apply. Any scratches in the Derby after 5:00pm the night prior to the Class will incur a \$35 Scratch Fee.

COMPETITION NUMBERS

OFFICE ISSUED NUMBERS must be worn in the competition rings.

SHOW OFFICE

Trainer packets will be available for check-in. Invoices will be sent via email at the end of the show week with the option to check out and settle accounts online. Barns are required to check in / check out with one representative handling barn account and all client paper checks.

TRAINER'S SPLITS

The horse show offers a service that allows the trainer to purchase shavings, feed, tack stalls, etc. directly from the Horse Show and then split the total amount for some or all of these items. Trainer splits will be accepted until noon Friday (no exceptions) of each show week. Trainers are reminded that this is a service provided by the Horse Show and that doing splits in a timely manner is their responsibility. Additionally, any splits uncollected from the client will revert back to the trainer for payment.

SETTLEMENT OF ACCOUNTS

All show accounts must be closed out at the end of the week. Any open entry accounts will be closed by management and a \$60 processing fee will be added per entry. All questions about show accounts must be addressed within 48 hours of the conclusion of the show.

SETTLEMENT OF ACCOUNTS CONT.

Any mistakes or questions regarding your horse show account and/or prize money must be resolved within 48 hours by contacting the Horse Show Office. **FOR CREDIT CARD PAYMENTS PLEASE NOTE: You MUST have your credit card present at check out.**

REFUNDS

STALL FEES CANNOT BE REFUNDED AFTER **Oct. 25**. Entry fees will not be refunded after **Oct. 25**, unless a certificate of illness or injury prepared by an accredited veterinarian, or a doctor's note regarding rider illness/injury, is presented to the secretary before the start of the show. Once the show has started, proper notification of the scratch must be made in the office BEFORE the start of the classes being scratched. In either case the entry fee will be refunded less any nominating fees, stall fee, and an office processing charge of \$75.00.

NON-NEGOTIABLE CHECKS

A \$50.00 SERVICE FEE OR 10% OF THE CHECK AMOUNT/ CREDIT CARD CHARGE, PLUS EXPENSES INCURRED TO COLLECT FEES, WHICHEVER IS GREATER, WILL BE CHARGED FOR ALL RETURNED CHECKS AND/OR DECLINED CREDIT CARDS.

CREDIT CARD FEE

A convenience fee of three percent (3%) of the total invoice will be added to all invoices being paid with a credit card.

USEF/USHJA FEES

Current USEF rules relating to drugs and medications will be enforced. Each horse entered must pay the \$15.00 USEF Drug/Medication Fee plus an \$8.00 USEF fee. Each horse entered will also be required to pay the USHJA Fee of \$7.00. (Total USEF/USHJA Fees \$30.00).

NOMINATING FEE

Horses competing in all 1.25 Meter classes, and above, must pay a nominating fee of \$150, unless otherwise stated.

RINGSIDE AMENITIES FEE

This \$40 fee includes the cost of video & display monitors for ringside instant replay as well as live streaming when available. Videos can be viewed at JKvideo.co. All rings are equipped with an outdoor monitor to view an instant replay of your completed round. All rounds can be watched the week of the show. Video downloads are subjected to additional fees. The \$40 fee is limited to two charges per owner/lessee per show.

NIGHT WATCH FEE

All horses occupying a stall, showing and non-showing, will be required to pay a show night watch fee of \$20. Horses will be checked each night of the show week every 2 hours. This service is NOT optional. USEF rule: HJ107i. Night Watch: Security and monitoring service offered to exhibitors, which must be available to contract at an additional cost, for horses stabled on the grounds.

RV SPOTS

RV spots are limited and come on a first-come-first-serve basis. Please fill out a request prior to **Oct. 25th**. Premium RV spots cost \$350/week and Original RV spots cost \$300/week. The fees include a pump out on Saturday. Additional pump outs available at an additional fee.

GENERAL RULES & INFORMATION

FACILITIES

STALLS

Permanent and temporary stabling will be available at a cost of \$300 per week. Ship-ins will be charged a \$125 grounds/clean up fee per horse per day. Stalls will be available for move-in on **Nov. 7th, 2022** after 10:00am, unless prior arrangements are made. 12x12 and 10 X 10 permanent and portable stalls, with doors and mats are available. Stalls must be returned to GSEC in the same condition upon move-in. All nails, hooks, etc. must be removed from stalls upon move-out. No sharing of stalls allowed. All stall reservations must be made with Barn/Stabling Manager. Stalls can NOT be resold without the Barn/Stable Manager's approval. Each horse will be charged either a stall fee or a grounds fee. Shavings and feed are available for purchase on show grounds between 7am -5pm. NO outside Shavings Permitted. Violators will be charged \$100 per stall.

SHARPS DISPOSAL

Sharps containers will be provided in all barns for the disposal of needles and other disposable sharp instruments. ALL items of this nature MUST be disposed of in the provided containers. NO SHARPS are to be disposed of in any receptacle other than the provided sharps container. Any individual or entity not in compliance will be subject to a \$100 fine per USEF 1210.4

OPERATION OF MOTORIZED VEHICLES

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will **not** be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above-described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate including but not limited to Segway's, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

DOGS

Dogs are not permitted to be loose on competition grounds and must be on a leash or otherwise contained. Individuals must not lead dogs on a leash while mounted. Dog owners are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from their dogs' behaviors. Dog owners failing to comply with this rule may be subject to a \$100 fine. In addition, pursuant to facility regulations, loose dogs will be removed by animal control, from the show grounds, at the owner's expense.

ARENA DIMENSIONS & FOOTING

Footing is a priority; rings may be closed to schooling during inclement weather and/or for maintenance at any time during the show at the manager's discretion.

SCHOOLING

Hunter Rings will be open for schooling on the day prior to the show. Time permitting, rings may also be open before and after the show each day, for hacking. Times to be posted or announced. No manual poling: no offsets of any type may be used while schooling. Jumping will be permitted in the rings at scheduled times and only when medical personnel are on the grounds.

ATTIRE/HEADGEAR

All riders must be properly attired. **Protective head gear must be worn BY ALL RIDERS AT ALL TIMES WHILE MOUNTED**, anywhere, anytime on the show grounds. Headgear for all riders must meet or exceed ASTM Standards; must carry the SEI tag; and be properly secured by a harness.

GENERAL RULES & INFORMATION

COMPETITION

JUMP ORDER

Show Management will determine a rotating jump order for all classes over fences. Riders or Trainers with conflicts must see the paddock masters in both rings so that the necessary adjustments can be made. Starters have the authority to scratch entries that make no attempt to be timely, without going through the Show Manager.

COURSES

Courses will be posted a minimum of one hour prior to each class. In Hunter classes, fences will simulate fences found in the hunt field such as brush, wall, in & out, oxer, post and rails, and gates. At management's discretion, a dotted line may be put into effect to restrict the size of the courtesy circle in hunter classes.

JUMPERS

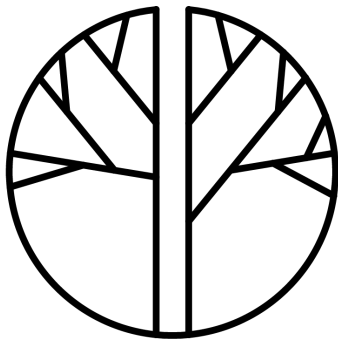
Ties in jumper classes will jump off for first place only. Ties for all other places will be determined by first round time. Champion and Reserve will be determined using the 10,6,4,2,1,1/2 Bonus Point system. Bonus Points will apply to the class indicated for each section.

CHANGES

Management reserves the right to change, cancel, or combine classes, alter courses and do all things necessary to compensate for excessive or inadequate entries.

PRIZE MONEY

Prize money is indicated for each class. Prize money won can be paid by check or deducted from each horse's account, or mailed within 30 days of the last day of competition. An IRS W-9 form must be completed in full before any prize money can be paid. Prize money will be withheld if the recipients Social Security number or EIN number is not on file. Prize money will be payable to the owner unless written authorization, and complete alternate payee information, is on file with the show secretary

Prize Money to Foreign Exhibitors:

Foreign exhibitors are advised that the US Internal Revenue Service requires sporting events to withhold 30% of the prize money won in the United States. Foreign exhibitors should apply for a US Social Security number and will be asked to complete FORM W8-BEN prior to prize money being issued. A valid Social Security or Federal ID number must be provided. Prize money will be withheld if the recipients Social Security number is not on file.

RIBBONS/TROPHIES/CHAMPIONSHIPS

All hunter classes receive a trophy and eight ribbons unless otherwise noted. All equitation classes receive a trophy and six ribbons unless otherwise noted. All jumper classes receive a trophy and six ribbons unless otherwise noted. Each hunter and jumper section will receive a champion & reserve award based on points unless otherwise noted. Full Championship points will be given in all classes in each hunter section except Green Conformation Hunter Model which will count as half points. In all hunter sections, Champion and Reserve Champion will be awarded to two of the top four horses acquiring the most points over fences. These four horses will also receive full points for one under saddle class. All ribbons and prizes can be picked up at the designated Ribbon and Prize room located in the offices next to the Main Arena.

GENERAL RULES & INFORMATION

HORSE REGISTRATION

All horses competing in Federation non-breed restricted licensed competitions with hunter, hunter breeding, jumper and hunter seat equitation classes (except those activities enumerated in GR901.9. items 1-9) must be properly identified and must obtain a Registration Number from USHJA. A registration number for each horse must be entered on all entry forms for licensed competitions. Proof of registration must be presented to the Show Secretary before numbers can be released. To be eligible for National, Regional or Zone Horse of the Year Awards, and to enter a USEF Computer Ranking List Class horses must also be registered with the USEF. Exception for USEF Computer Ranking List: Citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation need not have USEF Registration.

CREDENTIALS

All exhibitors in any pony, pony equitation, Junior Hunter or Amateur section **MUST** present their credentials (MEASUREMENT CARD OR AMATEUR CERTIFICATION) to the show office before their numbers can be released. Please submit a photocopy of credentials with entry to facilitate processing. All horses or ponies without a valid measurement card will be measured at a designated time and place. Anyone not presenting valid membership credentials (USEF/USHJA) will have to fill out a USEF/USHJA Show Pass form and will be charged a \$30.00 non-refundable show pass fee for USHJA and \$45.00 non-refundable show pass fee for USEF. Amateur exhibitors must present valid Amateur Credentials. Only a parent will be exempt from the Federation non-member fee if signing as coach for his/her minor child.

US EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION MEMBERSHIP AGREEMENT

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$45 Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) lead line; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR218) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

THJA MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT

THJA Members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at competitions recognized by THJA. A person/horse may register with the THJA at a recognized horse show as long as the application(s) and payment accompanies the official horse show results. Registrations may also be completed online with a credit card at the THJA website before the end of the show. All riders and trainers, in addition to owners of THJA registered horses must be members of THJA for the points to count.

THJA RECOGNITION

The Great Southwest Fall Classic is operated in accordance with the current rules of the Texas Hunter and Jumper Association by which they are recognized and rated "A" in Performance Hunters 3'3" and 3'6", Green Hunter 3', Green Hunter 3'3", Green Hunter 3'6", Green Hunter 3'9", Amateur Owner Hunters 3'3" and 3'6", Pony, Green Pony, Junior Hunters 3'3" and 3'6", Children's Pony Hunter, Children's Hunter, Adult Hunter, Low Adult and Low Children's Hunter, Short, Medium and Long Stirrup Hunter and JR/AO, Children's and Adult Jumper. Points for placing in Junior, Children's, Pony and Adult Equitation and Hunter Breeding Horses and Opportunity Walk/Trot Hunters and Opportunity Cross Rails Hunters will be credited in accordance with the rules of THJA.



ANIMAL WELFARE

We require that all horses be treated with kindness, respect and compassion and should never be subject to mistreatment. Owners, trainers, riders and grooms, or their agents must use reasonable care in the handling and treatment of their horses whether owned or placed in their care for competition or for any other purpose. At all times, while the horse is on the show grounds, we will provide for the continuous well-being of the horse. Abuse and use of whips will be strictly enforced. No poling, use of bamboo off set or excessive use of the whip will be tolerated. The well-being of the horse must be considered above the demands of the breeders, trainers, riders, owners, dealers, organizers, sponsors or officials. Violators may be subject to penalties pursuant to USEF rules. In the event of an acute and serious injury to or illness of a horse on competition grounds when the owner or trainer of the horse or agent of the owner is not present, after reasonable effort to contact that individual has been made, competition management, in consultation with a licensed equine veterinarian, may authorize the provision of emergency veterinary treatment of the horse. If competition management so authorizes treatment under the provisions of this rule, competition management and veterinarian are not liable for any resulting costs, damages, losses, claims or actions arising directly or indirectly from the treatment of the horse.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

GR845 EQUINE VACCINATION RULE: Horses entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the show grounds. Horses without proper proof of vaccines will not be permitted to enter the show grounds.

HEALTH CERTIFICATES/COGGINS TEST

A Health Certificate dated within 21 days of arrival to be presented when entering the show grounds. CVI must state the horse(s) has not been treated for an elevated temperature or anything related to herd health in the last 21 days. Horses without a Health certificate will not be permitted to enter the show grounds. Texas law requires that each horse be accompanied by a negative EIA certificate dated within one year. Horses without a negative EIA certificate will not be permitted to enter the show grounds.

HEALTH PAPERS

Please have a printed copy of your horse health papers to be left at the check-in location prior to entering The Great Southwest Equestrian Center.

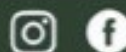

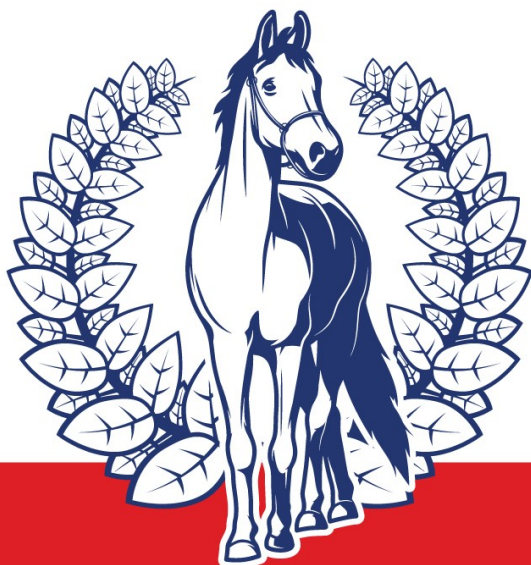

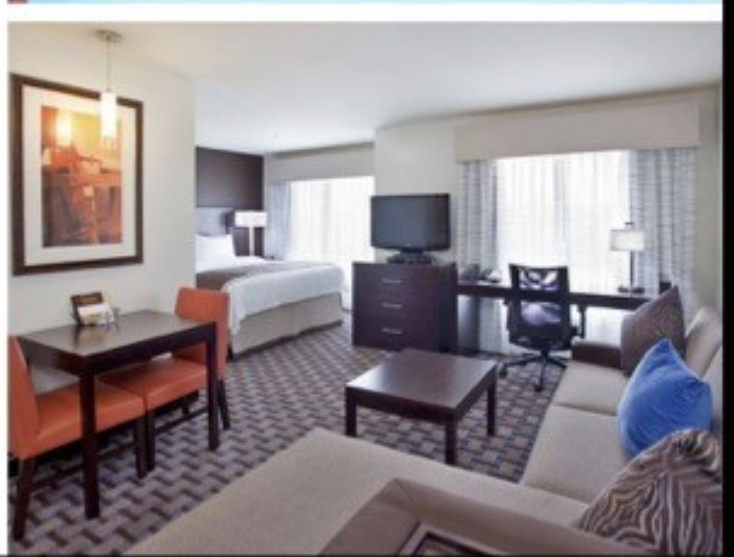

2022 USHJA Zone 7 Hunter, Jumper, and Equitation Specifications

In accordance with GR1111.4:

All members may compete for Zone Awards or money in any state contiguous to Zone 7: MS, TN, KY, IA, IL, NE, CO & NM.

JUDGING FOR ALL HUNTER SECTIONS:

- To be judged on performance and soundness, suitability to count.
- Horses and Ponies are not required to jog for soundness in the Adult Amateur Hunter, Children's Hunter Horse, and Children's Hunter Pony sections.

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADULT AMATEURS: HUNTER, JUMPER AND EQUITATION:

- To be ridden by exhibitors who have reached their 18th birthday as of December 1 of the current competition year and who hold a current USEF Amateur certification. Open to horses and ponies. State rules MAY prohibit entry of ponies.

ELIGIBILITY FOR CHILDREN'S SECTIONS: HUNTER, JUMPER AND EQUITATION:

- To be ridden by exhibitors who have not reached their 18th birthday as of December 1 of the current competition year. State rules MAY prohibit entry of ponies

ADULT AMATEUR HUNTER

Sections offered and requirements:

- Adult Amateurs – may be split into three (3) sections

Cross Entry:

Riders: The rider may compete on a different horse or pony at the same competition in any other division or sections for which the rider/horse or pony are eligible.

Horses: The horse or pony may be shown by a different rider in any other division or section at the same competition except Amateur Owner Hunter or a different age group in Adult Amateur Hunter Exception: A state association may adopt more (but not less) restrictive cross entry rules.

Horse and Rider Combination: The same horse (pony)-and-rider combination may not compete at the same competition in Amateur Owner 3'3" or any class in which fence heights exceed 3'3" Exception: Equitation and USHJA National Hunter Derby

Fence Height: • 3'0" with spreads not to exceed the fence height. • Courses will not be adjusted for ponies. • Combinations will be permitted

Combining/Dividing Sections: MAY be split into three sections:

- Adult Amateurs 18 – 35 • Adult Amateurs 36 – 49 • Adult Amateurs 50 & over

If any of the Adult Amateur sections have fewer than six (6) entries, they may, but are not required to combine with other section(s). If there are fewer than six (6) entries in the entire section, the Adult Amateur entries may, but are not required to combine with Children's Hunter Horse, but not the Children's Hunter Pony. One award will be offered for the combined sections

Awards: Zone Horse of the Year Awards will be presented annually to the following sections: • Adult Amateur Hunter 18- 35 • Adult Amateur 36- 49 • Adult Amateur 50 & over

LOW ADULT AMATEUR HUNTER

Eligibility: Open to exhibitors who have reached their 18th birthday as of December 1 of the current competition year.

Cross Entry:

Riders: Riders may not cross enter into any class or section at the same competition where fences exceed 1.15m or 3'9".

Horses: N/A

Horse and Rider Combination: Horse and Rider combinations may not cross enter into any class or section at the same competition where fences exceed 2'9"

Fence Height: • 2'6"

Low Adult Amateur Hunter Combining/Dividing Sections: The Low Adult Amateur Hunter and Low Children's Hunter sections may be combined if there are fewer than three (3) entries in either section.

Awards: Zone Horse of the Year Awards will be presented annually to the following section: • Low Adult Amateur Hunter

CHILDREN'S HUNTER HORSE

Sections offered and requirements: • Children's Hunter Horse 14 & Under • Children's Hunter Horse 15- 17

Cross Entry:

Rider: The rider may compete on a different horse or pony at the same show in any other division or section for which the rider/ horse/ pony are eligible.

Horses/Ponies: The horse or pony may be shown by a different rider in any other division or section at the same show except Junior Hunter or a different age group in Children's Hunter. Exception: A state association may adopt more (but not less) restrictive cross entry rules.

Horse and rider combination: The same horse (pony)-and-rider combination may not compete at the same competition in any class in which fence heights exceed 3'3" or any Junior Hunter Section. Exception: Equitation and USHJA National Hunter Derby.

Fence Height: • 3'0" with spreads not to exceed fence height • Combinations will be permitted • Distances will not be adjusted for ponies.

Combining/Dividing Sections: If there are fewer than six (6) in the Children's Hunter Horse section or less than four (4) entries in the Children's Hunter Pony, the sections may, but are not required to be combined. One award will be offered for the combined section. The Children's Hunter Horse section may, but are not required to be combined with the Adult Amateur section if there are fewer than six (6) in either section or with the Children's Hunter Pony if there are less than four (4), but may not be combined with both sections.

Awards: Zone Horse of the Year Awards will be presented annually to the following sections: • Children's Hunter Horse 14 & Under • Children's Hunter Horse 15- 17

LOW CHILDREN'S HUNTER HORSE

Eligibility: Open to exhibitors who have not yet reached their 18th birthday as of December 1 of the current competition year.

Cross Entry:

Riders: Riders may not cross enter into any class or section at the same competition where fences exceed 1.15m or 3'9".

Horses/Ponies: N/A

Horse and Rider Combination: Horse/Pony and Rider combinations may not cross enter into any class or section at the same competition where fences exceed 2'9"

Fence Height: • 2'6"

Combining/Dividing Sections: The Low Children's Hunter section and Low Adult Amateur Hunter section may be combined if there are fewer than three (3) entries in either section.

Awards: Zone Horse of the Year Awards will be presented annually to the following section: • Low Children's Hunter Horse

CHILDREN'S HUNTER PONY

Sections offered and requirements: • Small/Medium Children's Pony • Large Children's Pony • Prize Money: No minimum prize money is required.

Cross Entry:

Rider: Rider may enter any Equitation classes. The rider may compete on a different horse or pony at the same competition in any other division or section where the jumps do not exceed 3'0".

CHILDREN'S HUNTER PONY CONT.

Horse/Pony: Ponies competing in Children's Hunter Pony may not cross enter into the regular pony section.

Fence Height: • Small ponies: 2'0" with spreads not to exceed fence height • Medium Ponies: 2'3" with spreads not to exceed fence height • Large Ponies: 2'6" with spreads not to exceed fence height • Combinations will not be permitted

Combining/Dividing Sections: The Children's Hunter Pony and the Children's Hunter Horse sections may, but are not required to be combined if there are fewer than four (4) entries in the Children's Hunter Pony and fewer than six (6) in the Children's Hunter Horse section. Sections offered and requirements: • Low Adult Amateur Jumper • High Adult Amateur Jumper

Cross Entry: Competition Management may restrict cross entries between High and Low sections at the same competition if stated in the prize list.

Rider: If a High Adult Amateur Jumper classic is offered in the Children's or Adult Amateur Jumpers and the rider has jumped above 1.30m at that show then they are not eligible for any Classic in the Children's/ Adult Amateur Jumper sections.

Horse/Pony: N/A

Horse and Rider Combination: Cross entry into any class at 1.20m and above is not permitted for the same horse/rider combination at the same competition. Low Adult Amateur Jumper horse/rider combinations may cross enter into the High Adult Amateur Jumpers at the same competition. Cross Entry: Competition Management may restrict cross entries between High and Low sections at the same competition if stated in the prize list.

Horse and Rider Combination: Cross entry into any class at 1.20m and above is not permitted for the same horse/rider combination at the same competition. Low Children's Jumper horse/rider combinations may cross enter into the High Children's Jumpers at the same competition. Horse/rider combinations may enter only one classic, if both Low and High are offered.
